



Job Killer Electrolux - I'm not buying Electrolux!

Electrolux wants to close the half of its factories in Europe and relocate them to low-wage countries. The AEG factory is one of those affected, over 1750 jobs are to be lost. Even the new factory in Poland is already too expensive.

Electrolux's ruthless corporate politics is an example of the actions of globally operating corporations who are only interested in their profits. Thousands of employees across many national borders are equally affected by the axing of their jobs.

On October 5th 2005 the Deputy-leader of the 'IG Metall', the metal workers' trade union, threatened a boycott of Electrolux products if the company goes ahead with the closure of AEG in Nuremberg. "We will instigate a buyers' boycott of Electrolux products".

The idea of a boycott has already been taken up spontaneously by many Nuremberger citizens. They have reacted to the planned lay-offs by stating to the press: "We are not buying anything more from AEG-Electrolux".

We are supporting the struggle of the AEG workforce with this campaign.

We demand:

- The retention of all jobs at AEG and Electrolux!
- Prevent factory closures!
- Solidarity doesn't stop at the factory gates!
